Identifying areas of greatest need	Reviewed 2015 CHNA Social Determinants map. Identified areas of greatest need (those with social determinants grade of D and F) – Downtown Chambersburg and Waynesboro, South Mountain, Shippensburg, and North Franklin Co (Lurgan, Roxbury, Path Valley area); questioned how these social determinants grades were arrived at; considered other ways to identify areas of greatest need – free and reduced lunch #s	<b>Jay</b> - Look into social determinant grading criteria <b>Sheryl</b> – bring in updated free and reduce lunch #s to next FIWG
Food assistance resources	Discussed resources available serving those areas of greatest need. Denise is key contact for Waynesboro area. Began discussion of where to find food assistance resource listings – 211 (Stacy Yurko?), CHNA resource listing appendix, gardens from work group	<b>Sheryl</b> – pull food assistance resources out of CHNA appendix; <b>Denise</b> – send list of Waynesboro and Greencastle food resources to Sheryl; <b>Nickie</b> – provide garden listing <b>Jay</b> – provide gleaning project distributing community partners
Food assistance details	Brainstorm key info for each food assistance location to provide. Labels/map levels/data points for spreadsheet: Organization name Open to public? Address, Contact # Service area – zip code, school district, boro lines Income level eligibility – yes or no, and what the level is Days/hours open Resource type (pantry, after school, backpack program, dr. office, etc.) Type of resource offered (box of food, eater choice, etc.)	<b>Jay</b> – create spreadsheet with these criteria and email out to FIWG

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Maps	<p>Discussed what map tools to use – GIS or Google...</p> <p>FIWG is trying to map 2 separate things: 1) target areas; 2) hunger-relief resource locations (and programs)</p> <p>Questions to answer before we map:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Do we want consistency throughout NTF? CHNA 2015 social determinants is GIS. Gardens is google...</li> <li>2) Do we want consistency throughout Health Franklin County? Are any other task forces mapping?</li> <li>3) What does Franklin County government use?</li> <li>4) Can google and GIS talk to each other? Lay over top of each other?</li> <li>5) What are the audiences for these maps and the most understandable, accessible formats for those audiences?</li> <li>6) Maintenance requirements to keep maps up to date?</li> <li>7) Does the CHNA 2015 social determinants map accomplish our Goal #1 target area mapping? (see <a href="#">CHNA 2015</a>, appendix G)</li> </ol> <p>Target area mapping is for planning purposes. Hunger-relief resource mapping is for those suffering food insecurity, needs to be accessible. Would a map be helpful then? Why not just 211?? Add our newly collected points to 211? Or if 211 proves insufficient, a robust food resource guide that's much easier to build and maintain than a map? If that's the case, GIS might be the way to go to map hunger-relief for planning purposes... and create resource guide for food-insecure audience...</p> <p>Who can help us map?
