Work Group Updates	<p>Garden Workgroup – Kari Coleman reported on the Garden Workgroup activities. Based on the completed community survey, emails were sent to parties who had indicated an interest in participating in community gardening. To date, no responses have been received. The workgroup is considering conducting further surveys in the fall. Kari noted that the Boy Scouts will be utilizing the St. Paul garden and using the food to support a local food pantry. Kari will be assisting Head Start with their gardens. The Garden Workgroup has partnered with the Redwood community to utilize their garden bed, with the possibility of using 2 or 3 additional plots in the future. Noel Purdy volunteered to make a presentation to the Rec Advisory Committee requesting a new garden.</p> <p>Food Insecurity Workgroup – Sheryl Snider reported for the Food Insecurity workgroup. A food emergency provider list is being created. The goal is to map the higher need areas for free and reduced lunches and emergency food providers to determine the biggest gaps in service. The workgroup discussed promoting more awareness regarding food security in Year Two.</p>
