- Promote the Use of Community Health
  Workers to Improve Access and
  Coordination of Care Daphne said it is
  helpful for the health workers to live in the
  community and have relationships with
  the people there using a population
  model. Gaps exist in the community that
  need to be filled. There is a possibility of
  grant funding to pilot this program. Joanne
  asked Daphne and Pat to form a subcommittee to focus on this.
- Identify and Standardize Training and Certification Programs for Community Health Workers – This will be addressed by the CHW sub-committee

Goal 2: Increase the Number of Residents in Franklin County Receiving Preventative Services

- Objective 2.1 Increase the Percent of Providers that Report All Immunizations into the State Innovation Information System by 100% by December 2020.
  - Obtain Approval from State Department of Health/Governor's Office for Keystone to Immunize All Primary Care Providers in Franklin County – Keystone has already received approval. Pat informed the group that there are area providers other than Summit and Keystone that give care to children including Greencastle and Waynesboro Family Practices, Dr. Swartz, and Dr. Kramer. Pat and Joanne plan to be in contact with these providers.
  - Open State CFVs Program to All Primary Care Providers in Franklin County – This could happen and would entitle everyone to the free benefits that FQHCs give. Pennsylvania is 46<sup>th</sup> in the nation in public health. Good things have already been done as immunization laws have become stricter, giving parents only days to immunize their children after the start of school instead of months.
  - Promote and Establish School-Based Health Clinics – We may change this goal as the school would have to be open to the public without restrictions. This model could pose safety concerns.
  - Promote and Establish Patient Centered Medical Homes in All Provider Offices in Franklin County – PCMH is an agreement between the practice and its patients.
     Patients sign an agreement that they will provide their complete information

	including outside care, lifestyle habits, etc. to aid the practice in providing them with the best care possible. Also, patients are asked to contact their primary care provider before going to the ER, urgent care or any other outside physician. It is a team concept where everyone at the practice from physicians to nurses to receptionists work together to get the best results for patients, and patients are involved in setting their own health goals.  Goals 3 and 4 will be discussed at the next meeting.
