<p>A. Healthy Franklin County Needs Assessment 1. Update</p> <p>B. Scorecard for Community Health Improvement Plan</p> <p>C. Updates from Members</p>	<p>A.1. Noel discussed the Community Needs Assessment. This takes place every three years and the data is used to drive Community Health Improvement Plans, health initiatives, and more. They are starting data collection surveys the end of January and focus groups have already taken place. Top issues discussed so far include mental health, homelessness, food insecurity, and sexual abuse. Additional focus groups are also scheduled. The Assessment will be released on June 5.</p> <p>B. Noel reviewed the scorecard (attached, provided). She will obtain data for Strategies 1.1.1.3 (from Wilson College), 1.2.1.1 (from the Department of Health), 1.4.1.4 (RabbitTransit, and Lyft and taxi rides from Summit and Keystone), and 1.5.1.1. (from Keystone).</p> <p>C. Julie Beck, Associate Professor of Nursing, Director of the BSN Program, and Chief Nursing Officer at Wilson College, introduced herself as a new member of the group. She is excited to see how she can collaborate with the others in attendance to improve healthcare in our community.</p> <p>Jan Lewis updated the group on the Community Resource Guide created by Keystone Health to list community resources that will be helpful to patients who have social and economic needs. She can send the guide to anyone who would like to have it.</p>	

	<p>David Grant reported Keystone is still collecting data from its PRAPARE tool, used to collect social determinants of health data.</p> <p>Pam reported anyone who needs help paying for medications can be referred to her office. The 340B program is a good resource for patients who need assistance in this area.</p> <p>Daphne reported they have received approval for a 1.4 FTE care manager to work in the ED. This person will figure out if the hospital is the appropriate place for patients to receive care, or if they can be directed to other community resources. They hope this will lower the readmission rates and can develop care plans for patients who need them.</p> <p>Pat reported community health workers are stationed at the Towers of Falling Springs and another does home visits for diabetic patients. This program has been very successful. They are also doing drug and alcohol, literacy, and food insecurity assessments. They believe an official assessment will be ready in March or April.</p> <p>Donna reported their program has had a drop in income by 50% and they are now using a CNA to do foot checks and other tasks two days per week. They had 50 patients before the cut, were down to 32, and can now have up to 45. She is monitoring their progress to see how many patients they can handle.</p> <p>Eunice reported she is now attending as a community member as her WCHS Board commitment is finished. She works as a substitute teacher and works with IRP on program development.</p> <p>Noel reported on the needs assessment earlier in the meeting.</p>
