<p>A. Healthy Franklin County Needs Assessment</p> <p>B. Community Health Needs Assessment Report</p> <p>C. Scorecard Data Review</p> <p>D. Transportation Access</p>	<p>The group did introductions and welcomed a new member – Gabby Ratliff from Franklin County Planning Department.</p> <p>A. Noel reported the Needs Assessment is wrapping up and the release event is June 5. The document will be available publically the end of June. The theme is Building a Culture of Health.</p> <p>B. After the assessment is completed, they will focus on the Community Health Improvement Plan and will look at action plans and update them annually.</p> <p>C. Noel reported they are looking at performance measures every year and will assess our goals going forward.</p> <p>D. Pam Laye reported many of her clients need someone to accompany them to appoints and it is becoming a real need in the community. Dave said this could possibly be part of the role of a Community Health Worker. Summit's health worker already does this and also picks up produce from SCCAP before going to homes with food insecurity. Eunice suggested providing insurance to churches or community members who wish to help.</p> <p>Gabby reported the Franklin County Planning Department is looking into multi-modal transportation opportunities. Pat suggested a bus system with regular stops at fixed times. Gabby will talk to RabbitTransit</p>	

E. Social Determinants	<p>about this possibility. Reliability is key. She will also talk to PA Commuter Services to see if and how they can help, as well as Melanie at the SpiriTrust Lutheran's transportation program.</p> <p>Pat suggested looking into other options such as using school buses between morning and afternoon pickups. Brandi thinks this would be difficult to arrange with the school system. Eunice mentioned churches have buses too.</p> <p>E. There is a section on the Needs Assessment about social determinants of health. If anyone has questions about the performance measures, they can ask Noel. Keystone is continuing to collect data as well. Summit/WellSpan and Keystone both hope to use the information to improve access to what our community needs. Waynesboro Community and Human Services is also hoping to implement surveys in the near future.</p>	
6. Updates From Members	<p>Donna said staffing is an issue at Community and Human Services and they're hoping to get Penn State students involved with the program.</p> <p>Brandi said access is always an issue at the school district and about 56% of kids are on free or reduced lunches. They are focusing on mental health next school year.</p> <p>Melanie Furlong said many homebound patients are in need of in-home healthcare. There are also many people under 55 who need care and many people are also just over the income level for MA but also need help.</p> <p>Stephanie Unger said all students in her community health classes need projects so let her know if they can help with data collection, research, or any other needs.</p>
