

A. Healthy Franklin County Needs Assessment 1. Timeline	A.1. Noel reported Summit has done Franklin County Needs Assessments for the last 20 years and also did a Community Health Improvement Plan. Access members can use the document any way they like as it is meant to provide useful information to lead to better access. It is a year-long process. Timelines are in place for the entire process, including collecting data, survey instruments, public release, and developing the CHIP. They are taking the public health approach and using social determinants of health to drive the project.

B. Scorecard for Year 1-2-3	B. Goal 1.5 is: Reduce disparities in access and quality of care and improve outcomes across Franklin County's pediatric population ages birth to 5 years using Keystone Health Center as their provider. Joanne reported the new Director of Head Start has begun a collaboration with Keystone in their Women's Care office. A Head Start case manager has been imbedded in the practice and talks with expectant mothers. This allows Head Start to get involved with the families, provide education, conduct home visits, and more. We hope the program will eventually expand to

Keystone also plans to open an Education Department.</p> <p>Goal 1.6. states: Keystone Health will utilize the PRAPARE tool (NACHC) to collect Social Determinants Of Health (SDOH) on patients at Keystone Health by October 1, 2018. Keystone is currently collecting data and we will discuss this more at the next meeting.</p> <p>Strategy 1.6.1.1. is: Keystone will develop more refined risk stratification criteria to help identify patients who would benefit from increased care management resources by November 2018. RN case managers at Keystone are looking at all patients and identifying those at high risk.</p> <p>Goal 1.7 is: Keystone will provide target education to patients of Keystone and to the community at large. This is still in progress but would impact all of our goals.</p> <p>Joanne encouraged all members to come up with a goal before the next meeting and to send it to herself, Emily Eshleman or Christina Methner.</p> <p>C. Pat reported Summit is having difficulty with primary care providers retiring, moving away, etc. We need to educate the community that PAs and CRNPs also provide great care and can make great PCPs. They are trying to improve recruitment and access. Community health workers were hired through a grant and they have seen success.</p> <p>Kathy Jo Reinsmith is the co-op coordinator and a business teacher for the Chambersburg Area School District. She sees kids every Friday leaving school with groceries because many do not have a good home life and enough to eat over the weekend.</p> <p>Daphne reported Summit is working on getting patients into the right level of care (including transitions), and have had great success.</p> <p>Jan reported Keystone is working on a document with community resources for our providers to give to patients.</p> <p>Kris reported a physician has been added to Ludwick's staff and has been a great addition.</p> <p>Brandi Glenn-Akers reported the school district is focusing on mental health services, SEL programing, and purposeful play in kindergarten classes. They are still looking at redistricting options.</p> <p>Donna Brandmeyer believes that she will be able to use</p>	
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	the PRAPARE tool and it will be useful to her patients Sheri Morgan reported MHA is using a teen peer specialist program and is developing a research hub. They are working on literacy and health literacy and developed an educational plan.
